Digital Literacy: Getting Directions with Google Maps Lesson Plan

Objectives

At the end of the lesson, students will be able to:

(1) Open Google Maps

- (2) Get directions to the Hartford Public Library using Google Maps
- (3) Get directions to another location of their choice using Google Maps

2	2 min.		Overview: Getting Directions Google Maps is a desktop mapping service developed by Google. It offers satellite imagery, street maps, views of streets (Street View), real-time traffic conditions (Google Traffic), and route planning for traveling by foot, car, or public transportation.		Say: We will be spending time today learning about how to get directions using Google Maps. Ask: What is Google Maps? Why is knowing how to use Google Maps important to you? Say: We are going to follow a series of steps to help you use Google Maps to get directions to the Hartford Public Library.

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		Practice Activity (found on the last page of the Student Guide): Start from the beginning and in the address bar type in google.com/maps and hit enter. Choose a business or location that has a name you can search in the Hartford area. Where are you trying to go? Type in the location that you picked into the Google Maps search and hit enter. What is the address of the business you are searching? What is the email address? What is the phone number? What hours are they open today? Look for directions from 30 Arbor Street Hartford, CT. Choose one of the direction options. How long will it take you to get there? How many miles?	 3. Do: Ask students to think of a location that they would like to find in the Hartford area. Ask them to follow the prompts and answer the questions on the last page of their Student Guide. Assist, as needed. Note: If students need suggestions to a business or location in the Hartford area, options include: Mark Twain House, BJ's, XL Center, etc.
