

Dear friends,

Resiliency is a word we use a lot around LVGH. Most often we discuss how resilient our students are in the face of barriers, but I also think that it perfectly describes our organization as a whole. This past year was again a year of learning, responding, and adapting to the peaks and valleys of the pandemic. Despite this, it was also another year of student successes and organizational growth.

The year started with an on-site career and resource fair, which helped us kick off our return to in-person learning. Due to the spread of the Omicron variant, changes in weather, and other factors, our class roster fluctuated between in-person and virtual throughout the year. This brought its own challenges, but most importantly, we learned how to bring the best of digital learning into the in-person student experience through further digital investments. With a mixture of virtual and in-person classes, we were able to serve 506 students last year, a 45% increase in participation from the previous year.

It is your support, volunteer hours, and investment that has afforded LVGH the resources necessary to continue to meet the needs of students, especially during challenging times. Innovation is at the core of LVGH, and with obstacles come opportunity. As we emerge from the past few years and return to some sense of normalcy, we do so as a more innovative and dynamic organization than ever before.



FY 2021 - 2022 Income Sources (unaudited)


Revenue
